#### Scenario:

You are working for a tourism business (depending on your field of study – a hotel, a restaurant, a bar, or a travel agency). The company has decided to improve its environmental responsibility by adopting **zero-waste practices** and promoting **sustainable mobility options** for guests and staff. You are asked to design a plan that helps the business reduce pollution and operate in a more resource-efficient way.

#### Task:

Develop a **Zero-Waste and Sustainable Mobility Plan** for your tourism business. The plan should include concrete actions and strategies that can realistically be applied in daily operations to reduce waste, limit pollution, and support eco-friendly travel choices.

#### **Content Guidelines:**

- **Identify and analyse key sources of pollution** in your business (e.g., single-use plastics, food waste, high transport emissions) and explain how they impact the environment.
- **Propose at least three practical zero-waste measures**, such as replacing disposables with reusable alternatives, introducing refill stations, or using digital tools to cut paper and packaging waste.
- Suggest at least two sustainable mobility measures, such as promoting bike rentals, offering discounts for public transport, or providing electric shuttle services.
- Develop an action plan that includes:
  - Short-term measures (low-cost, easy actions that can be implemented quickly)





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- **Medium-term measures** (actions that need investment, training, or supplier collaboration)
- Long-term measures (strategic goals for a zero-waste and low-carbon operation)
- Include a timeline and basic budget estimates for implementation.

### 1. Application of Zero-Waste Practices

Reduces or avoids single-use plastics (e.g., straws, bottles, packaging).

Separates waste correctly (recyclables, compost, general).

Uses or promotes refill stations, reusable containers, or eco-friendly alternatives.

Monitors or reports waste amounts in daily operations.





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### 2. Promotion of Sustainable Mobility

Chooses or encourages eco-friendly transport options (bike, walking, public transport, EVs).

Provides guests/customers/ teammates with information about sustainable mobility choices.

Supports workplace/ educational initiatives (e.g., bike-sharing programs, shuttle systems).

#### 3. Environmental Responsibility in Daily Work

Actively participates in zero-waste and mobility initiatives of the business or the education provider.

Suggests new ideas to further reduce pollution in the workplace/ education institution.

Encourages colleagues/guests/ teammates to adopt eco-friendly habits.

#### 4. Consistency and Results

Demonstrates sustainable practices regularly, not occasionally.

Shows measurable improvements (e.g., less waste generated, lower transport emissions).





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Receives positive feedback from colleagues/supervisors/ teammates for environmental responsibility.

After completing the assessment, summarize the findings:

• High-level performance (average score 4–5):

Consistently applies zero-waste and mobility practices, acts as a role model.

• Medium-level performance (average score 3):

Applies some practices but inconsistently, needs further support.

• Low-level performance (average score 1–2):
